

## Privacy policy on the processing of personal data during the application process for the SECAI Scholarship program

### For what purposes is personal data to be processed?

Personal data is processed for the application process of the SECAI Scholarship Program.

### What is the legal basis for processing personal data?

The legal basis for data processing for the above-mentioned purposes is Art. 6 para. 1 subpara. 1 lit. a and, if applicable, Art. 9 para. 2 lit. a GDPR (consent).

### How is the personal data processed and how long is it stored?

The personal data will be collected via LimeSurvey operated by BPS Bildungsportal Sachsen GmbH. The personal data will be deleted after the application process for the SECAI scholarship program is completed. The data will be deleted immediately should you revoke your consent.

### Is personal data transmitted to third parties?

Personal data will not be transmitted to third parties. Exception: an anonymous summary will be reported to Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst e.V. (DAAD) restricted to nationality, gender, and target study program.

### What are the basic rights of data subjects?

#### Voluntariness and revocation (Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR)

The provision of personal data is voluntary for digital distance examinations. Consent can be refused or revoked at any time informally and without giving reasons to the person responsible. Your personal data will then no longer be processed and will be deleted immediately, unless the realization of the research objectives would probably be impossible or seriously impaired by this and there is another legal basis than consent for the processing (in particular Section 12 para. 1 SächsDSDG).

#### Right to information (Art. 15 GDPR)

You have the right to request information about the data processed about you and the possible recipients of this data at any time. You are entitled to a reply within a period of one month after receipt of the request for information.

#### Right to rectification, erasure and restriction (Art. 16-18 GDPR)

You may at any time request TU Dresden to correct or erase your personal data or to restrict processing.

#### Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)

You may request that the controller(s) transmit your personal data to you in machine-readable form. Alternatively, you may request the direct transfer of the personal data you have provided to another controller, where this is possible.

Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR)

For reasons arising from your particular situation, you may also object at any time to the processing of personal data relating to you in the context of a digital on-site inspection. Provided that the legal requirements are met, your personal data will subsequently no longer be processed.

Right of appeal (Art. 77 GDPR)

You can contact the TU Dresden data protection officer at any time (see above) as well as a supervisory authority for data protection in the event of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 GDPR.
